HORS SATAN (France/2011/109 minutes/French with English subtitles/Certificate tbc) By the Channel, along the Côte d'Opale, near a hamlet with a river and a marshland, lives an unusual guy who struggles along, poaches, prays and builds fires. A girl from a local farm takes care of him and feeds him. They spend time together in the wide scenery of dunes and woods, mysteriously engaging in private prayer at the edge of the ponds, where the devil is prowling...

The director of *Uzak* and *Three Monkeys*, Nuri Bilge Ceylan, has established himself as one of the new masters of cinema. With his new film *Once Upon a Time in Anatolia*, he offers us an epic and rigorous tale of a night and day in a murder investigation.

THE NINE MUSES (UK / 2010 / 92 mins / 1:85 / Dolby SRD / Certificate: tbc). Directed by John Akomfrah. Structured as an allegorical fable and loosely inspired by existential science fiction, *The Nine Muses* is a stylised, unusual and idiosyncratic retelling of the history of mass migration to post-war Britain through the suggestive lens of Homer's epic poem, *The Odyssey*.

MYSTERIES OF LISBON (Portugal/France 2010/272 minutes/French with English subtitles/Certificate tbc) Directed by Raúl Ruiz, this epic retelling of the novel by Camilo Castelo Branco has been widely hailed as the summation of Ruiz' career.

HADEWIJCH (France/2009/ 105 minutes/French with English subtitles) Bruno Dumont's extraordinary new film which won the FIPRESCI Award at this year's Toronto Film Festival. Named after a thirteenth-century mystic, Hadewijch presents the spiritual journey of Céline, a young novice nun, played by Julie Sokolowski in a riveting performance, who is expelled because of her overzealous faith, and sent back into the world. This extremely moving film has already been compared to the work of Robert Bresson.

AROUND A SMALL MOUNTAIN (36 Vues du Pic Saint Loup) (France/Italy/2009/ 84 minutes/French with English subtitles) is the latest from French New Wave veteran Jacques Rivette. This gentle comedy stars a grieving Jane Birkin and a mysterious Sergio Castellito. Set in a circus, the film focuses on a woman tortured by past events, as tensions and passions of past and present come together.

AURORA (Romania/France/Switzerland/Germany 2010 / 181 min Romanian with English subtitles / 1:85 / Certificate: tbc). Written and Directed by Christi Puiu, the long awaited follow-up to **The Death of Mr Lazarescu** is the second in his projected series of 6 films dealing with life in Romania. **Aurora** is the story of the fall of an ordinary man – an imperfect fall without glory. The film follows Viorel for two days as he wanders Bucharest. Wherever he is, he feels the same strange nervousness, the same muffled anxiety and the same urge to end the instability that rules his life. He buys a rifle and ammunition, then goes back home to test his weapon...

PUZZLE (Argentina/France/2010 / 88 mins / Spanish with English subtitles / 1:85 / Dolby SRD / Certificate: tbc) Written and Directed by Natalia Smirnoff. Maria del Carmen is a forty-something housewife whose only concern over the past twenty years has been the wellbeing of her husband and of her now grown-up kids. But when she is offered a puzzle for her birthday, she suddenly discovers she has a very special gift: she can assemble puzzles really fast.
